



Seedlings

A select number of miscellaneous tree seedlings are available and are looking for good homes, free-of-charge, to residents committed to babysitting them through winter and beyond. The varieties are from the Arbor Day Foundation and include trees that have the potential to grow very tall. Ensure you have the room and are committed to caring for the tree over the winter and into the future.

For example, the white pine will grow up to 50-80 feet tall with a 20-40-foot spread. If you are brave, other varieties available are Norway spruce, red maple, dogwood, pussy willow, and a few unidentified trees, all free of charge!

Planting and caring for the tree seedlings will help reduce erosion, provide shelter and nutrients for animals, insects, and microorganisms. An adult tree can exchange 48 pounds of carbon into oxygen each year, enough to keep two people alive. Please consider adopting the seedlings for a free tree, and feel free to reach out to us if you are interested!

Construction of Fountain Together's tree nursery came to a grinding halt on Friday due to Fountain's "snowstorm." When completed, the facility will receive seedlings grown by Chelsea Mansour in her basement hydroponic system.

The seedlings will be distributed free of charge by Fountain Together in 2021. We plan to distribute and plant 1,000 trees throughout the Fountain area in conjunction with Michael Alcazar's "One Million Trees for Colorado."

Tree planting is part of the group's overall effort to make Fountain a better place for people and animals, including birds and pollinators.
